Résumé <i>Abstract/Resumen</i>	<i>(abstract excerpted from the URL cited above)</i> “The South East Queensland region in Australia is experiencing rapid urban growth. In response to this growth, regional level planning and reporting frameworks have been developed relating to both hard infrastructure and natural resource management. However, there has been no formal acknowledgement of a similar need for regional responses as regards the social dimensions of sustainable development. This paper describes a two year action research process, involving diverse public, private and community stakeholders that focused on developing a social sustainability framework in response to this issue. Key components of the framework are discussed, including social capital, social infrastructure, social justice and equity, and engaged governance. Broad implications for policy and practice are discussed.”

Résumé <i>Abstract/Resumen</i>	<i>(abstract excerpted from the URL cited above)</i> “Credit is indubitably one of the most important sectors in which the supply of goods and services by cooperatives has arisen. Given the importance of the role of cooperative banks in the development of other sectors and of the territories or communities in which they operate, and the economic and political power that they consequently confer on those who manage them, some of the inherent problems distinctive in general of not-for-profit organizations become critical. In particular: in the case of rapid growth beyond the original group and area, the possibility of maintaining the principles of reciprocity and participation; the role and motivations of the social entrepreneurs acting in the bank; the corporate social responsibility, which, in the case of a bank, is closely connected to how the community’s savings are employed and how investments are selected. As with other cooperative enterprises, credit can be supplied in a variety of forms with different purposes and with different positive and/or negative externalities. Evaluation of the respective advantages and disadvantages must bear in mind the different contexts in which individual banks operate, considering both theoretical aspects (potentialities) and historical ones (past and present modes of operation). These inherent problems are discussed in the first part of the work from a theoretical point of view; while in the second part the first applications and the debate that accompanied them are analysed, given their importance in determining the features of subsequent experiences. In particular, we shall show that they stem from two different interpretations of solidarity and reciprocity: the first one, theorized and, to a certain extent, realized in the Raiffeisen model, is mainly ethical in nature; the second one, typical of the Schulze Delitzsch model, is more closely tied to individual interests tempered by social responsibility.”

Résumé <i>Abstract/Resumen</i>	<i>(abstract excerpted from the URL cited above)</i> “This article aims to explore policy advocacy processes facilitated by social service nonprofit organizations (NPOs) using a social justice lens. Qualitative interview results from 39 NPOs from 18 communities provide a deeper understanding of advocacy, revealing that NPOs perceive that policy advocacy is not a discrete phenomenon, that advocacy activity differs in visibility and scale, and that advocacy strategies are clearly informed by NPOs’ front-line service delivery work. A typology of policy advocacy showing different advocacy types and their fluid nature is presented. The results also show that marginalized people’s involvement varies depending on a diversity of influential conditions. Conclusions and implications focus on

	social inclusion/exclusion, the varied and fluid nature of policy advocacy, challenges for practitioners, and the complex nature of “advocacy chill.””

Résumé <i>Abstract/Resumen</i>	<i>(abstract excerpted from the URL cited above)</i> “Despite their social mission, social enterprises work in the global economic environment and therefore have to comply with performance objectives. This situation means that human resources management strategy has a crucial role to play. More particularly, the challenge in maintaining competitive efficiency standards depends on achieving a low level of permanent staff turnover. This paper aims to study the role of distributive justice, leader-member exchange, job satisfaction and organizational commitment regarding the intention to quit in social enterprises. Data were collected in France from 101 permanent employees in 27 work integration social enterprises. The partial least square structural equation modeling technique was used to assess the model hypothesized in the study. Whereas the results confirm most of the model paths, distributive justice was not linked to both organizational commitment and job satisfaction. Finally, managerial implications in the field of human resource management are derived in order to achieve a lower turnover level of social enterprises permanent staff.”

Résumé <i>Abstract/Resumen</i>	<i>(abstract excerpted from the URL cited above)</i> “The purpose of this paper is to explore the notion, and dynamics, of trust between social enterprises and the public sector in two different cultural contexts. The strategy was to ask very simple and broad questions of a number of people in the social enterprise/public sector nexus, and allow them to talk. This talk was recorded and analysed for patterns and insights. This paper looks in detail at one of the insights derived from this wealth of data and makes a startling claim, one that needs further investigation and thought, that in social enterprises, trust precedes performance. The research is based on grounded theory and comprises a series of semi-structured interviews based on a common framework undertaken in two countries - the UK and Poland. The research indicated an unsolicited pre-occupation with trust relationships between the social enterprises and the public sector organisations. The research suggests that trust precedes performance, in that the public sector partner extended a trust relationship before the organisation was able to demonstrate their track record. This challenges EU public procurement rules which require that an organisation demonstrates competency and track record before a contract is let.”

Résumé <i>Abstract/Resumen</i>	<i>(abstract excerpted from the URL cited above)</i> "The paper offers a contribution to the understanding of the relations between incentives, satisfaction and performance of employees in social enterprises. It starts by criticizing the general hypotheses of the principal-agent theory and especially that employee satisfaction is determined exclusively by the level of salary received. These criticisms are explained both by looking to the organizational definition of job satisfaction by Locke and by taking a behavioural economics perspective. Job satisfaction is thus assumed to derive from a composed mix of incentives received on the job, equity perceived and employee motivations. It is no longer possible to assume that the wage is the sole (not even the most important) variable influencing worker performance. This claim is especially valid in social enterprises, where worker performance is difficult to monitor and evaluate, while high intrinsic motivations can better explain job satisfaction. The empirical analysis helps to shed light on the determinants of job satisfaction and individual performance. Data was collected on 4,134 employees working in 320 Italian social cooperatives."

To date, no study has investigated the factors that influence the strategic decision by an NPO to focus their advocacy resources on the bureaucracy. This essay models the decision to engage in administrative advocacy by 501(c)(3) organizations as a function of the <i>state-level</i> political environment in which they deliver services and the organizational resources that they possess. Data on advocacy activities and organizational characteristics of family planning NPOs are drawn from tax records and data compiled by the National Center for Charitable Statistics."

Así, los valores de la cooperativa y de sus miembros, la estructuración del capital, las actitudes del personal o su proximidad a los clientes de su ámbito operativo les confieren unas características específicas que merecen ser estudiadas para gestionar sus ventajas competitivas y ofrecer información relevante para la toma de decisiones.
