Abstract excerpted from the URL cited above: “Governance and Regulation in the Third Sector brings together scholars and experienced practitioners from different countries to investigate the relationship between regulation and relational governance for the third sector in a comparative context. Each chapter reviews recent regulatory changes in the country in question. To what extent are there significant convergences in these reforms and what are the implications for the third sector? Is there any evidence that the foundational architecture for a more collaborative relationship between the state and the third sector has been laid? Overall, the book reveals that the reality of the supposedly new collaborative relationships and the impacts of regulatory reform are quite different from what contemporary theories of public management would have us believe. Recognizing the gap between theory and reality, the chapters explore some of the outstanding challenges for regulatory reform for the third sector.”

Abstract excerpted from the URL cited above: “Theories of nonprofit density have assumed a variety of dispositions toward the state, including opposition, suspicion, indifference, and mutual dependence. In this article, we conduct the first large-scale simultaneous empirical test of the two most prominent nonprofit theories: government failure theory and interdependence theory. The former characterizes nonprofit activities as substitute or oppositional to state programs, accounting for the limitations and failures of government-provided services and more reflective of the heterogeneity of demand for services. The latter emphasizes the more complementary and collaborative nature of nonprofit activities, focusing on the overlapping agendas of nonprofits and the state and the mutual dependency that arises from partnership. The theories are difficult to test empirically because both predict the same relationship between state

capacity and the size of the nonprofit sector, albeit for theoretically distinct reasons. A true joint test requires the separation of government support from private support for nonprofits. Using a newly constructed panel dataset in which we separate out nonprofit revenue sources normally agglomerated in the Internal Revenue Service 990 data, we examine the empirical merits of both theories to answer the question of whether human service nonprofit organizations thrive when government fails or when government collaborates. Our findings suggest that government funding has a more favorable effect on nonprofit density than private donations. The findings raise several policy and management implications that need evaluation.”

Abstract excerpted from the URL cited above: “It is generally accepted that common high quality financial information standards are essential in a global economy. The comparability of financial information is necessary in order to facilitate the decision-making process with regard to capital flows between different countries. This complex harmonization process focuses attention on investor- owned business. Nevertheless, this process cannot progress without an appropriate analysis of the nature of other types of entity. General criteria may be insufficient or inadequate when applied to entities, such as co-operatives, in which there is a difference from the basic ownership parameters of a company. International accounting standards setters are involved in a project that reconsiders the principles that should determine the distinction between equity and liabilities. Many of the specific characteristics of co-operatives have a bearing on the recognition and measurement of their equity in the balance sheet.”

Abstract excerpted from the URL cited above: “In the field of business, the concept of result (surplus) is used to define the objective of the economic activity. Such an objective however could be very different depending upon the chosen perspective. Cooperative associations are a special kind of companies that combine economic and social objectives, trying to achieve their social aims while allowing the members to benefit from a positive financial profit, although not as a function of the contributed capital, but to the cooperative work they have served. This work reviews from a critical standpoint the concept of surplus (profit) currently

applied to cooperatives, linking it with the foundational coop objectives. Along with the financial profit or loss, we propose to account for a second financial accounting profit by the enterprise, which we may call adjusted financial profit or loss. We also propose the introduction of a new accounting statement, which will allow obtaining further information about certain economic actions not entirely reflected in the current accounting statements of the cooperatives.”

Abstract excerpted from the URL cited above: “The main objective in this research paper is to contribute to the literature on the governance of co-operatives by offering new empirical evidence from a Finnish context about the differences between the financial performance and efficiency of co-operatives and limited companies. In this study we define these company forms according to the Finnish legislation (the Finnish Limited Liability Company Act for investor-owned businesses and the Co operative Act for co-operatives). The starting point of our work is the significant difference between the legal purpose of limited liability companies and consumer co-operatives and the accounts in the recent research about the accentuation of managerial power in consumer co-operatives. Therefore, in order to ascertain whether or not co-operatives operate according to their purpose, we examine how agency costs and surplus distribution differ between co-operatives and limited companies. The empirical data for the study was collected through a financial statement database. The initial population consisted of Finnish regional consumer co-operatives and private limited companies. The empirical data was analysed using quantitative methods. The analyses revealed that there are significant differences between co-operatives and limited companies. The main finding of our study was that agency costs are significantly higher in co-operatives than in limited companies, which is in line with the previous research.”

Against this background, the contributions in Third Sector Performance acknowledge that, as a result, more imaginative ways of delivering public services are being sought. In countries like the UK, the new concept of The Big Society envisages third sector, or not-for-profit, or charitable organizations and social enterprises stepping in to mitigate the loss of vital public services. This development also gives rise to the likelihood that third sector financial institutions such as credit unions and a possible 'Big Society Bank' will grow in importance. The performance of all these enterprises looks set to become a much more critical issue than it has been in the past. Abstract excerpted from the URL cited above: "Notably one of the principles most prominently associated with Rochdale Co-operation is the system of paying dividend, a rate of return based on purchases rather than capital holding. This article argues that the dividend, though important, was only one aspect of financial assistance co-operative retail societies offered their members. By focusing on the period of the 1920s-40s, it explores how collective strength and mutual aid provided by societies extended to financial support during periods of economic crisis and industrial action. Credit in times of need was especially important for members of societies affected by trade depression, industrial crisis and unemployment during the interwar years. The article also argues that membership could give access to much wider support than is typically associated with the retail aspect of co-operative societies. For example, societies assisted individual members, or the families of members, during periods of illness and death. The article highlights how, as trading organisations, the spirit of mutual help within co-operative retail societies incorporated an element of collective expenditure. In addition to providing support for hospitals located in the communities in which they traded, societies also offered financial aid to nationally recognised charities. In this way financial assistance and support provided through the co-operative business model was not solely focused on extending the purchasing power of individual consumers."

Abstract excerpted from the URL cited above: "In 2006, the European Economic and Social Committee (EESC) commissioned a Report from the International Centre of Research and Information on the Public, Social and Cooperative Economy (CIRIEC) in order to take stock of the Social Economy in the 25 member states of the European Union. A precondition for this stocktaking was to identify a core identity that is shared by all the companies and organisations in this sphere. Its purpose was highly practical: so that the Social Economy (SE) can be visualised and recognised. Which, how many, where, how they have developed, how large or important they were, how the public and governments saw them, what problems they solved and how they contributed to the creation and equitable distribution of wealth and to social cohesion and welfare: these are the questions that the Report addressed. In 2011 the EESC decided to bring the Report up to date in order to include the new member countries, Bulgaria and Romania, and two candidate countries, Croatia and Iceland, as well as the earlier members. Once more, it commissioned CIRIEC to carry out the work, the results of which are presented in this Report. The Report has been written by two experts from CIRIEC. The directors and writers, José Luis Monzón and Rafael Chaves, are both members of the Institute of the Social and Cooperative Economy of the University of Valencia (IUDESCOOP-UV) and of the CIRIEC International Scientific Committee for the Social Economy."
